## New SCDA Position to Focus on Helping Farmers with Food Safety Compliance

Everyday South Carolinians enjoy fresh locally grown produce, and the South Carolina Department of Agriculture (SCDA) is continually working to make sure fresh fruit and vegetable food safety is a top priority.

In order to help farmers in this effort and to better serve consumers, the SCDA, in a cooperative agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture, now has a statewide Food Safety Coordinator, Weatherly Thomas. Thomas will mainly focus on helping interested farmers develop food safety plans for their farms and attaining Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP) certifications.

"Having a Food Safety Coordinator to help farmers and growers have the tools necessary for becoming GAP/GHP certified is important not only for increasing food safety, but because it also creates more marketing opportunities for our farmers," said South Carolina Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers.

Many schools and other institutions that have a food service component often look for and require GAP/GHP certifications. Farmers that meet those standards are able to sell their produce to that growing market.

Participation in these certifications is voluntary. While assisting farmers with fresh fruit and vegetable food safety compliance, Thomas will be able to explain the requirements of safety-oriented record keeping. Thomas will also perform mock food safety audits and provide advice on how to improve food safety on the farm.

Prior to accepting the position as Food Safety Coordinator for the SCDA, Thomas served as the South Carolina Farm to School Midlands Regional Coordinator, where she also helped educate farmers regarding GAP/GHP requirements.

## Upcoming Workshops Offered for Farmers Interested in Transitioning to Organic Farming

Farmers interested in learning about transitioning to organic farming can plan to attend one of two workshops offered in November. The Organic Transition for Produce Farmers workshops are scheduled for Nov. 8 in Charleston and Nov. 29 in Columbia.

These one-day workshops run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and will feature local experts on organic farming. They will discuss the organic certification process and requirements, provide practical tips for farm planning and record keeping, and other topics related to organic farming.

The Nov. 8 workshop will take place at the GrowFood Carolina Warehouse located at 990 Morrison Drive, Charleston, 29403. The Columbia workshop will take place Nov. 29 at City Roots Farm located at 1005 Airport Blvd. Columbia, 29205. The cost is \$12 per person.

The workshops are hosted by the Carolina Farm Stewardship Association and funded by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture through the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.

## Taking Advantage of New Opportunities

Readers of the *Market Bulletin* have probably read in my columns where I talk about the term 'agritourism' from time to time. It is one way farmers are reaching new heights and marketing their farms to consumers by trying new things all while helping others understand agriculture and its impact in our everyday lives.

This phenomenon of touring farms is not new. In a book I read a couple of years ago called the *Founding Gardeners* about Washington, Jefferson, and others and their love for farming, it seemed common that folks would visit each other's farms to learn more about new farming practices 200 years ago. It was well attended with some 200 people dining on foods all sourced from 50 miles from the farm and prepared by four different chefs. The chefs used grass fed beef and fruits from Chattooga Belle. The dinner was a hit!

Ed took advantage of sweeping mountain views and his orchards when he built his events barn to host weddings and events like the Farm to Table dinner. Chattooga Belle offers u-pick orchards, tours for school groups, and a Certified SC farm store. Something I found interesting is that the land where Chattooga Belle sits was once owned by Groucho Marx.

An even longer distance from Long Creek is Scott Thompson down in Conway. They have also expanded their business through agritourism. Scott, a part-time pilot and fourth generation farmer, jokes that not only can he drive a tractor but, he can also fly a plane. Scott and Ed may be at opposite ends of the state, but they are reading off the same sheet of music when it comes to their businesses.

Scott's fall vegetables and spring strawberries were just a launching pad to growing into a bustling operation. This year 20,000 school children will visit the farm where they will feed cattle and see the farm's three buffalo and camel. While touring the farm, students can also take classes taught on just about any subject including weather. That's an important subject for both farmers and pilots. Thompson Farms boasts the largest corn maze in the state at eight acres and a 6,000 square foot enclosed barn they turned into a haunted house.

Here at your SC Department of Agriculture, our mission is to support farmers like Ed and Scott in their efforts and to expand one component of our state's most vital industry. We are pleased with some recent legislation passed by the General Assembly benefiting both farmers and agritourists. This new law created a Tourist Oriented Direction Signage program (TODS). It will be administered by SC DOT with the assistance from the Department of Ag and others.

Now that the law has passed, SC DOT is in the process of drafting regulations and going through public comment. We anticipate that regulations will pass and they will become effective in July of next year. Our readers should stay tuned for more details about the program and who will be eligible to participate. Our main goal is to provide a uniform signage program that will help tourists and visitors find rural agritourism opportunities located off of main highways.

Families looking for something fun, inexpensive, and a way to teach their children about the importance of agriculture can find it on a farm. So whether it's Chattooga Belle Farms in Oconee County or Thompson's Farm in Horry County or somewhere in between, there are farms statewide offering something unique for everyone - and now is a great time to get outside and take your family to one of the many agricultural events.

## Sweet Potato Cheesecake

### Crust

1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs      1/3 cup butter or margarine,  
1/4 cup granulated sugar                      melted

### Cheesecake

3 (8 ounces each) pkgs.,                      2 eggs  
cream cheese, softened                      2/3 cup evaporated milk,  
1 cup granulated sugar                      undiluted  
1/4 cup light brown sugar                      2 tablespoons cornstarch  
1 3/4 cups sweet potatoes,                      1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
mashed    1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

### Topping

2 cups sour cream,                              1/3 cup granulated sugar  
room temperature                              1 teaspoon vanilla extract

**Crust:** Combine crumbs, sugar, and butter in bowl. Press onto bottom and 1 inch up on sides of 9 inch springform pan. Bake at 350 degree F for 6 to 8 minutes. Do not allow to brown. Remove from oven and cool.

**Cheesecake:** Beat cream cheese, sugar and brown sugar in large bowl. Beat in sweet potatoes, eggs, and milk. Add cornstarch, cinnamon and nutmeg. Beat well. Pour into crust. Bake at 350 degrees F for 55 to 60 minutes or until edge is set.

**Topping:** Combine sour cream, sugar and vanilla. Spread over warm cheesecake. Return to 350 degree F oven and bake 5 minutes. Cool on wire rack. Remove side of pan and chill several hours or overnight.

1 9-ounce can crushed pineapple                      1/2 cup butter  
1 lemon    1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 orange    flaked coconut (optional)

Thinly slice lemon, orange and sweet potatoes. Alternate layers of potatoes, orange and lemon. Combine pineapple, sugar, butter and salt. Pour over potatoes. Sprinkle coconut on top, if desired. Bake at 30 to 40 minutes or until tender in 350 degree F. oven. Yields 8 servings.
